The *JKS* is dedicated to high-quality articles, in all disciplines, on a broad range of topics concerning Korea, both historical and contemporary. The *JKS* also publishes selected reviews of recent Korea-related books.

Recent articles published in the *JKS* include Jung-Sun Park and Paul Y. Chang’s consideration of the controversial 1999 Overseas Korean Act; Brian Yecies’ study of the systematization of film censorship in colonial Korea; and Michael Kim’s examination of literary production, circulating libraries, and private publishing in the late Chosŏn period.

SUBMISSION PROCEDURE

The *JKS* editors and editorial board welcome submissions for publication. The *JKS* is published annually in the fall.



Article manuscripts, including notes, should not exceed 50 double-spaced pages in length. Please submit two hard copies and an electronic copy of the manuscript. (The electronic version can be submitted on disc or via email.) Footnotes should be at the end of the text. For style and documentation format, consult the *Chicago Manual of Style*, 15th ed. (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 2003).

Romanization of Korean words and names must follow the McCune-Reischauer system. Materials that have been accepted for publication or are being considered for publication elsewhere should not be submitted to the *JKS*.
